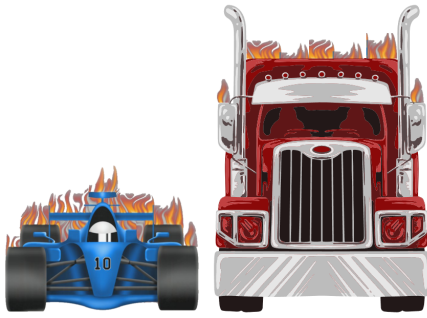

RACING RULES AND REGULATIONS 2026

Rule # 1 – Have a fun and exciting race!

Registration:

- The Kub Kar rally is open to all Cubs registered in the current scouting year (2025-2026). Pre-registration is mandatory. Walk-in registrations cannot be accepted.
- Cubs should be in full uniform. Scouters are expected to supervise their youth at all times.
- Racers must design and build their own Kars (adult “assistance” is **strongly discouraged** except to help with cutting out the basic shape, mounting the wheels and advice).
- Only one Kar built in the current scouting year per Cub may be entered into the race. Kars built/raced in previous years are not permitted. **2026 must appear on the bottom of the Kar in permanent marker on bare wood**
- Once inspected at check-in, a Kar may not be altered in any way, unless permission is given from the race committee.

Construction:

- All axles, wheels and body parts must come from Scout Canada’s official Kub Kar kit. No outside kits please!
- Kars must be freewheeling and gravity powered. No auxiliary forms of propulsion will be tolerated.
- No loose items (weights, characters, trim, etc.) will be permitted. Please ensure everything is properly secured.
- Kars must make full-time use of all four wheels.
- Each Kar should have the driver’s name and pack written on its underside.
- The underside of the kar may not be painted in any way.

Specifications:

All Kub Kars must pass the following inspection at check-in to qualify for the race:

- Overall width, including wheels, shall not exceed 7 cm. (2 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches)
- Length shall not exceed 17.8 cm (7 inches)
- Weight shall not exceed 142g (5 ounces)
- Height shall not exceed 7 cm. (approx. 3 inches)
- The minimum distance between the wheels is 4.5 cm (1 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches)
- Clearance between the chassis and the track should be 0.95 cm (3/8 inch)

Finishes:

- Decorative items (fenders, spoilers, characters, etc.) may be used as long as they are in good taste and do not exceed width/length restrictions.
- Glue may be used for joining parts.
- Paints and enamels may be used for finishing, but the entire bottom of the vehicle must be left unpainted.
- A racing number will be assigned to each vehicle. The assigned registration number must appear on either the sides or the top of the vehicle.

Wheels and Axles:

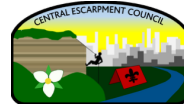
- No bearings, bushings, or washers. No steering systems. Kars may not ride on springs or other suspensions.
- Wheel profiles must not be altered in any way. Spurs and molding may be removed. Wheel positions are fixed.
- Axles may be polished and lubricated before weigh-in. Only dry lubrication (ie., graphite powder) may be used. Do not use liquid lubricants.

Racing:

- Participants are expected to be in attendance at the track for the race, unless alternate arrangements have been made and approved with the Kub Kar Rally committee.
- We will have a computerized track that will determine both place (1st, 2nd, or 3rd) and race time per kar. The winners are determined by the average time. Each kar will be scheduled to run on each track at least once, time permitting. The time is stored and the average time is used to pick the finalists for the final race.
- Re-runs may be necessary in certain situations (e.g., system problem). Race officials will determine whether a re-run is required.
- Race officials have the final say. Disagreeable participants and/or spectators will be asked to leave.
- Good sportsmanship is expected from everyone involved.



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SCOUT TRUCKS

RACING RULES AND REGULATIONS 2026

- Scouts and Venturers, please remember your Motto – “**Be Prepared**”
- Participants (drivers) **must** be in **full uniform** at and during race time
- All decisions of the judges are final
- Trucks are to be made only from the Scouts Canada Truck kits
- **Only NEW Scout Trucks may be entered, previous years entries may not be reused – 2026 must be written on the underside of the truck with permanent marker on bare wood**
- Once the truck has been given the final weigh-in and assigned a number: Only Race Officials will be permitted to handle the truck until such time that it is returned to the owner after the Awards have been handed out.
- Each Scout Truck will be assigned a number prior to racing and one placed on top of the cab, one on top of the trailer and one on the back of the trailer
- Eliminations begin after the completion of the two heats of racing
- Individual racers' number & lane placement will be called just prior to each heat. Absent Scout Trucks will be called for the first two heats
- If an Scout Truck jumps the track and disrupts another Scout Truck in the race, the race will be run again. The results of the re-race will stand
- Scout Trucks will only be returned after **all** races have been completed
- We will have a computerized track that will determine both place (1st, 2nd, or 3rd) and race time per truck. The winners are determined by the average time. Each truck will be scheduled to run on each track at least once, time permitting. The time is stored and the average time is used to pick the finalists for the final race.
- Only tied Scout Trucks will continue to race to determine their final placing

- In the event that a repair is required, they must be approved prior to the completion of such repair and the work must be done within the pits and monitored by the Pit Officials
- All Scout Truck designs must reflect Scouts Canada's Mission and Principal statements; Judges decisions are final

Specifications

- **All Scout Trucks shall comply with the following requirements:**
- **NO** substitutes for the original wheels and nails as supplied with the kit
- **NO** modification of stock wheels except for the removal of the injection die and spur bump which results from the manufacturing process
- **NO** hole drilling, wafering, thinning of, or major dimensional changes to the stock wheels
- **NO** wheel bearings, washers, bushings, collets, etc.
- Wheel axles and their heads may be polished to remove burs
- **NO** springs, axles shall be directly attached to the chassis body and parallel to the track
- **WHEELS:** No modifications are to be made to the wheels, except painting and/or a light sanding. Wheel bearings, washers, and bushings are prohibited. All 18 wheels shall spin, be "in contact" (as much as possible) with the track/table, and have solidly anchored axles.
- The cab must have 10 wheels & the trailer must have 8 wheels
- **GRAPHITE LUBRICATION PROHIBITED**
- **MOVING or LIQUID WEIGHTS ARE PROHIBITED** all weights must be fixed into position
- Overall length shall not exceed 44.5 cm
- Overall length shall be at least 42 cm
- Overall width shall not exceed 8.5 cm
- Overall height shall not exceed 11.5 cm
- Maximum weight shall not exceed 900.0 grams
- Width between the inside faces of wheels shall not be less than 44.5 mm
- Trucks (cabs) and Trailers must swivel, and be able to be separated at anytime
